

SPOTLIGHT – MUNICIPAL PARKING DECK

MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR PROJECT



A critical component of the necessary continuum of responsible ownership of municipal capital projects and infrastructure are the less-glamorous maintenance and repair programs that ensure the long-term useful life of these public assets. With that in mind, this issue's Spotlight goes to the City of Auburn's Gay Street Municipal Parking Deck Maintenance and Repair Project. This parking deck occupies a critical space within the core block of downtown Auburn, and provides 250 parking spaces for residents, visitors, and City staff. The deck was constructed in 1986, consists of three levels (one at-grade and two supported), and includes a structural system of precast concrete beams and columns supporting precast concrete doubletee decks. The current restorative maintenance and repair work includes



various repairs to the precast structural elements, extensive waterproofing (including traffic coating membrane over top deck and on stair tower floors), cleaning of the drainage system, and re-striping of the second and third levels.

Delegate Update

- Current Membership is approximately 200 members in all classifications.
- Founded in 1947 the Alabama Chapter recently celebrated its 75th Anniversary in 2022.
- In January, the Board accepted the resignation of President Elect, Justin Barrett.
- Mr. Ronnie Huskey, Director, was sworn into the vacant Vice-president's position.
- The Board is still on the look-out for dedicated Public Works professionals to help fill two (2) current Director Vacancies and a pending third vacancy that will be created when the vacant President-Elect position is filled.
- To help increase public awareness, honor front-line professionals, and perform outreach, the Chapter held its 2nd Annual Equipment Roadeo on May 25, 2023, at Garrett Coliseum in Montgomery, AL. Nine (9) jurisdictions and utilities participated in the rodeo, and several others attended as spectators.
- Membership, outreach, and involvement are the key issues that the Chapter and the Board continue to focus on. The pandemic and budget concerns among municipalities and organizations have certainly impacted our efforts for outreach and involvement and by default membership has been impacted. Additionally, many of our longtime members are at or near retirement.
- There is continued interest and discussion among the Board about planning Regional after-hours events, to include, but not limited to, corn-hole events, meet and greets, etc. Many of these discussions center on who will organize in the region and the potential need for private sector sponsors to offset costs for members and potential members.
- The Chapter held its joint summer conference with ASCE at Perdido Beach resort on July 12-14. As part of this conference, there were two (2) educational tracks that attendees could pursue. One track focused on Engineering specific topics and the second one focused on Public Works related topics.
